Amazing Longwood Gardens

Highlights: Join us as we travel by a fully equipped Motor Coach to experience the World's #1 rated formal gardens Pennsylvania's **Longwood Gardens** - highlighted by a laser light evening fountain show! We will visit this national treasure by day and evening on this 3 day excursion to the incredible Brandywine Valley. First, we will travel to nearby **Valley Forge**, PA, site of George Washington's Continental Army headquarters and encampment during the winter of 1777. A park guide will recount the history as we visit the grounds which remain remarkably unchanged. We end day 1 with an Italian dinner at a nearby Trattoria. On Day 2, we visit the **Hagley Museum** in the morning, home of French chemist E.I. Dupont who started a gunpowder mill and became one of America's foremost industrialists. Visit the home on 215 acres along the river, witness a gunpowder demonstration and learn about the extraordinary DuPont family. Among the **Dupont family** legacies is Longwood Gardens, which encompasses 1100 acres



of gardens, woodlands, water features and an incredible indoor conservancy with one of the world's largest pipe organs. Late in the afternoon we will return to the nearby hotel for a short rest and to freshen up for dinner. We will return to the Gardens for dinner in the elegant **1906 restaurant**, followed by an amazing **fountain**, **light and music show**. On Day 3 after check-out, we will visit another Dupont masterpiece –Henry Francis DuPont's **Winterthur Museum**, **Library and Gardens**. Our last stop will be nearby Chaddsford Winery for a private tasting.
