Present Strong Lineup**

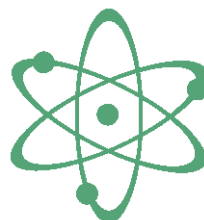

He and his wife Cheryl live in Shrewsbury and have two daughters, Stephanie and Jessica.



The common link between the four men seems to be the golf course, Green Hill to be exact. When the beloved Al Monfreda passed away, it left a hole in the ranks of Greendale officers.

STAN SWENSON got a call from John Kelly, golf coordinator for the Greendale match play league and long-time club official. "The club needs you," said Kelly. "I'll let you know," was Swenson's reply. He is now the First Vice President. "Here I am two years into a learning curve. It's great helping people. I'm enjoying retirement."

NFL quarterback Bob Griese, tennis star Arthur Ashe, champion figure skater Dorothy Hamill and daredevil motorcycle stunt man Evel Knievel among other celebrities. Simply said, he came up with a cam arm, a curve-shaped device to keep the frame eyewire securely in place.

A lifelong resident of Southbridge, Russ went to work for American Optical after six years in the Air Force including a stint as crew chief at an air base in South Viet Nam. AO was one of the biggest optical companies in the world. Russ went on to own a machine shop where he made aluminum eyeglasses and worked a lot with Harley Davidson, thus the connection to Knievel. He said he used to put together eyeglasses in one month that would take two years from sketch to a finished project for a company.

His military duty led to Post Traumatic Stress and he joined a group with other veterans. It wasn't long before he also tried golf and teamed up with Rick Ferguson at Green Hill. They also golf during the winter at an indoor facility in Framingham. He had joined the Retired Friends Club to be able to play golf. Then the question was asked. Would you mind giving some time to help out at the club?

Now, Russ is the Second Vice President. "It's rewarding and interesting. I enjoy the people." Though Russ prefers the solitude of his self-built home on a marshy piece of land on a lake in Southbridge with his wife Françoise, an IV nurse with an ongoing business, Russ is making calls and setting up future entertainment for the club. He and Fran were childhood sweethearts and have been married for 52 years. They have two daughters, Natalie and Caroline, and four grandchildren.

JOHN PEPI is a Worcester guy from Grafton Hill who went to Dartmouth Street School, St. Peter-Marian, Worcester State College, Cambridge College and attained his doctorate in Education at the University of Phoenix. Along the way he played some varsity football and basketball. Sports were his thing and he was a physical education instructor.

John eventually progressed to athletic director for the Worcester Public Schools in 2007, serving for 11 years. He instituted many ideas including the Worcester Athletic Hall
